New Testament Survey/Introduction I: Gospels

Class Meetings: Wednesday, 11.15am-1.00pm; 2.00-3.00pm

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Course Description

This course is the first installment of the 2-part course on New Testament Survey/Introduction. It is intended to help you begin to weave yourself through the maze of NT studies. You will be introduced to the practice of the scholarly and critical study of the background of the Inter-testamental and Second Temple period, the New Testament, and the question of introductory problems of the Gospels (authorship, date, audience, structure, and purpose). The content and theological themes of each of the Gospels will be explored. A survey of the life and teachings of Jesus will also be given special attention in this course.

Course Objectives

By the end of this course, you will be able to:

- 1) provide the historical background to the period of the New Testament.
- 2) give an overall outline, the broad account of the occasion, content, and major themes of the Gospels.
- 3) begin to explore the different areas, disciplines and aspects of NT studies and learn how to do basic research and writing in NT studies.
- 4) apply the relevance of the Gospels and the teaching of Jesus in contemporary Christian living as well as the life of the church.

Course Requirements

- 1) Read the Gospels in an idiomatic English translation of your choice.
- 2) Graded requirements:
 - a. Term Paper (60%): Write a research paper with proper footnotes and bibliography related to a defined topic, theme or area of critical NT studies related to the Gospels. The length of the paper is stipulated in the Academic Handbook. Various topics will be suggested during the class. Please feel free to run by your idea with me before proceeding with your paper. This paper is due on Wednesday, **APRIL 24, 2019, 4.30pm.** Any extension beyond the due date will automatically result in 1/3 grade penalty.
 - b. Class presentation (30%): Do a 15-minute class presentation on topics that will be circulated at the beginning of class. More details will be provided in the class.
 - c. Journal (10%): At the end of each class, there will be a 10-15-minute period to write down your reflections/thoughts/insights/what you have learned from the lecture in a journal. The purpose is for you to reflect on your learning process. You may choose to do this exercise in your computer, or in a journal to be provided for you in the class. At the end of the course, you are to indicate if you

have done your journaling at the end of each class, and if you have done so, you will automatically be awarded 10% of the total grade.
