New Testament Survey/Introduction: Letters & Revelation
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Course Description

This course is the second installment of the 2-part course on New Testament Survey/Introduction covering Letters and Revelation. It is intended to help you begin to weave yourself through the maze of NT studies. You will be introduced to the practice of the scholarly and critical study of Pauline Epistles, Catholic Epistles and Revelation. Questions concerning authorship, date, audience, structure, and purpose of selected NT letters will be covered in greater depth compared to others. The content and theological themes of some of these books will be explored. A survey of the life of Paul and critical approaches to Pauline studies will also be given special attention in this course.

Course Objectives

By the end of this course, you will be able to:

- 1) give an overall outline, the broad account of the occasion, content, and major themes of some of the NT Letters and Revelation.
- 2) begin to explore the different areas, disciplines and aspects of NT studies and learn how to do basic research and writing in NT studies.
- 3) apply the relevance of the teachings found in the Letters and Revelation in contemporary Christian living as well as the life of the church.

Course Requirements

- 1) Read Letters and Revelation in an idiomatic English translation of your choice (e.g., NIV, NRSV, ESV, NET, NASB, etc)
- 2) Graded requirements:
 - a. Term Paper (60% of the grade): Write a research paper with proper footnotes and bibliography related to a defined topic, theme or area of critical NT studies related to the NT Letters or Revelation. The length of the paper should be approximately 2,500 words excluding footnotes and bibliography. Various topics will be suggested during the class. Please feel free to run by your idea with me before proceeding with your paper. The due date of the paper is on **October 5, 2017 (Thursday), 4pm**. Please note that no extension is allowed (unless for family emergency only - not that preaching, leading a mission trip, or youth camp do not constitute a reason for extension) and any delay in submitting your paper will automatically attract a 1/3 grade penalty per 24 hour period.
 - b. Class Presentation (40% of the grade): Do a class presentation on topics that will be circulated at the beginning of class. More details will be provided in the class. A sign up sheet will also be provided.
